

Occupational Therapy Observation Verification

Applicants may use this form to document observation hours. Forms from other schools and/or from the site where the applicant observed are also acceptable. The applicant will scan and upload the completed forms to their OTCAS application.

The University of Florida's Doctor of Occupational Therapy Program observation requirements are as follows:

- 30 hours of observation in at least two (2) diverse OT settings. Diverse settings are those that serve significantly different clientele: inpatient, outpatient, long-term care, schools, elders, pediatrics, orthopedics, rehabilitation, etc.
- Observations must be with a licensed occupational therapist or a licensed occupational therapy assistant.
